

Camp Takodah Covid Protocols and Guidelines for Women's Weekend

We are working closely with the New Hampshire Department of Health & Human Services (NH DHHS) and the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) to ensure groups meets and/or exceeds all federal, state, and local health and safety laws, rules, and regulations.

Please note that while Camp Takodah seeks guidance from the CDC, we are ultimately required to follow the Overnight Camp Guidelines mandated by the NH DHHS for all groups.

In addition to working with the NH DHHS and CDC, we have assembled a COVID Advisory Team of local medical experts to guide our COVID Safety Plan and provide ongoing advice and support throughout summer camp. We have also hired a COVID Safety Officer to ensure compliance with our COVID Safety Plan.

We strongly encourage you to become familiar with the COVID Safety Plan – along with the risks and benefits of camp – so you can make an informed decision about your participation in Camp Takodah's Women's Weekend this year.

By signing the Covid 19 waiver, you are agreeing to abide by and adhere to the following protocols and guidelines.

GUIDELINES

PRE-CAMP PROCEDURES

All Person(s)

- Person(s) with weakened immune systems or [underlying health conditions](#) are strongly encouraged to consult their healthcare providers about participating in Women's Weekend.
- Person(s) and their families are strongly encouraged to choose [safer activities](#) that reduce the risk of infection or exposure during the 10 days before arrival.
- Person(s) and their families are strongly encouraged to follow CDC [domestic travel](#) and [international travel](#) recommendations during the 10 days before arrival.

Vaccinated Person(s)

- Provide a copy of their COVID Vaccination Card.

Unvaccinated Person(s)

- Provide proof of a negative PCR test that was conducted no more than 72 hours prior to arrival.
- International Person(s): Adhere to a home quarantine during the 10 days before arrival.

Proof of vaccination and negative PCR test will be required prior to or upon arrival at Camp. Anyone not providing this information will not be able to attend the weekend and will be asked to leave.

COHORTING / FACE-MASKING / PHYSICAL DISTANCING / HYGIENE PROCEDURES

Cohorting

- Each cabin will function as a “family unit” where face-masking and physical distancing is optional. If you have a “family unit” please let us know so we can make cabin arrangements.

Face-Masking

- Person(s) will not be required to wear masks with their cabin cohorts.
- Masking will be optional for outdoor activities.
- When Person(s) are inside buildings with person(s) and/or staff from other cohorts, then they will be required to wear masks (e.g., Dining Hall, Bathhouses, TPAC/NoPAC, Hobby Nook).
- During times when masks are optional, all persons will create a supportive and affirming environment for anyone who chooses to wear a mask.

Hygiene

- Person(s) will be required to practice regular handwashing.
- Person(s) will be required to cover their noses and mouths for coughs and sneezes.
